RHUBARB



- Rhubarb is a staple plant found in most fruit gardens. As winter slowly receeds the rhubarb plants burst into life with their fastgrowing crowns pushing up through the soil so fast you can almost see them grow.
- It is a large plant that will appreciate a moist but free-draining soil, with a fair amount of sunshine. In terms of space, it is best to allow it an area of around 3ft / 1m in which to reach its full potential.
- The plants we offer are generally 2nd year crowns, and are best planted directly into soil that has been enriched with well-rotted manure. You should avoid harvesting any rhubarb in the first year as this will allow the plant to build up a good root system, and your patience will be rewarded in later years.
- Rhubarb crowns can be 'forced' to provide an extra early crop, but it is best to wait 2 years before you force a crown as it does place a lot of extra stress on the plant to crop so early.
