- Gourds are part of the same family as pumpkins, squashes, marrows and courgettes.
- They are grown more for their ornamental appearance than their eating qualities, but can be eaten if picked very small, before their skins have thickened, and are best treated as a courgette in terms of how to cook with them.
- Their odd shapes, textures and markings make them eyecatching, and particularly interesting for getting children interested in veg growing, as many gourds can be decorated once they have been harvested and allowed to ripen fully.
- Many of these gourds can be allowed to dry, then hollowed and then turned into bird-boxes or decorated
