LEMON BERGAMOT



Lemon Bergamot is a hardy perennial that has intense lemon-scented leaves perfect for desserts, savoury dishes or making a herbal tea. It will grow up to 4ft tall, 18" wide when planted in a nutrient-rich soil in a semi-shady spot, or in full sun if kept well watered. The leaves are also a magnet for bees.

BORAGE



Borage will grow up to 2ft tall and has star-like flowers that are beloved of bees and other pollinators. The cucumber-flavoured leaves can be used for tea and other beverages and the flowers make a colourful addition to a salad. The root is the only part of the plant that is not edible.

CATMINT



Nepeta goes by the names of catmint or catnep. It is a perennial, and grows vigorously, forming good sized bushes relatively quickly. This is just as well as it is also known for its effect on cats, with them rolling around in it and generally getting high, but don't worry, it has no harmful effects on your cat, even if they eat it.

CARDOON



Most people know this plant by its other name - artichoke. We have both the green and purple varieties available. The flower-heads are edible when picked small and young, and it is also a great plant for attracting bees and other beneficial insects. They are large architectural plants, and have been part of the medicinal herb garden for centuries.
